Community Legal Information Association of PEI Inc. (CLIA) is a non-profit registered charity. We provide information, referrals, and support on legal issues.

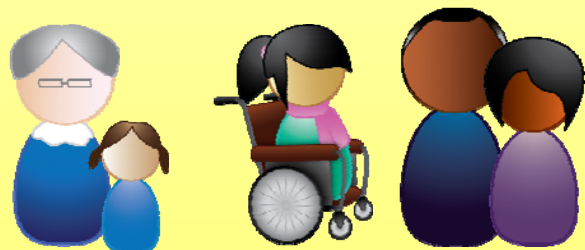
Our goal is to provide understandable and useful information about our laws and the justice system. Our work is called public legal education and information (PLEI).

Lawyer Referral Service

Island lawyers volunteer to provide short consultations for people who have legal questions or need basic legal advice. There is a modest fee for this service. This service depends on the generosity of Island lawyers who donate their time and expertise. We will need your name for a lawyer referral.

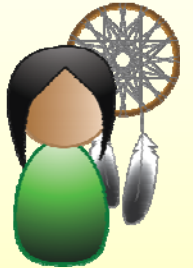
Publications

We have over 70 CLIA publications on federal and provincial laws, as well as publications produced by other organizations. All are available free of charge. Topics range from buying property on PEI to child support, to being an executor for a will. All of our publications are available on our website (www.cliapei.ca) or can be mailed or picked up. Most are available in both official languages.
